FRANKLIN UNIVERSITY, COLUMBUS

TIFFIN UNIVERSITY

A total of 6 semester hours of credit may be granted towards our Bachelor of Criminal Justice (BCJ) or Master of Science (MS) program if the student fulfills the requirements set out below:

- 1. The student must be admitted to the BCJ or MS program.
- 2. The student must complete the entire PELC program and submit a copy of the certificate to Tiffin University.
- 3. The student will need to submit their collection of PELC documentation (10-15 papers completed during PELC) and/or write one 10-12 page paper on an assigned topic related to the Tiffin University courses for assessment of credit.
- 4. Students awarded Undergraduate (BCJ) PELC credit, waive Graduate (MS) credit eligibility.
- 5. The student must pay \$100/per course for a total of \$200 for the 6 semester hours of credit.
- 6. The assigned faculty member will be paid \$150 to review the paper.
