Matthew Fisher has served as the Chief of Police for the Wooster Police Department since 2011. He has been involved in various aspects of the department during his career, including the Wooster Police Honor Guard from 1999 - 2004 and Canine Handler (with canine partner, Ringo) from 2000 - 2007. Fisher has also served as a Taser instructor, ASP instructor, and a Certified Canine Evaluator.

Prior to working for the department, Fisher earned a B.A. in Business Economics from The College of Wooster and completed the Police Academy at The University of Akron. He is a graduate of the 240th session of the FBI National Academy and holds a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice Administration from the University of Tiffin. He has been an adjunct professor of Criminal Justice for both Ashland University and The University of Akron. In addition, he holds his Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy certificate as an instructor, and he regularly teaches at the Wayne County Career Center Police Academy. Fisher is a graduate of the Police Executive Leadership College and Leadership Wooster. He is currently serving on several different boards including: the OACP Advisory Services, the Medway Drug Task Force, and the Wayne County Voices for Children Committee.
