Chief Michelle Lee has been the Chief of Police for the City of Kent Police Department since 2011. The Kent Police Department employs 43 sworn officers, 24 civilian positions, operates a dispatch center and a 12 day jail facility. She earned her undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Akron in 1985. Chief Lee is a graduate of the Police Executive Leadership College class XXXII, attended FBI Great Lakes Leadership College in 2009 and Certified Law Enforcement Executive class XX.

Chief Lee was the first female ranking officer and Chief in the department and has been a member of the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police since 2007. She has served as Vice President for two years and currently serves as President of the Executive Board for Metro SWAT serving Summit and Portage counties. Chief Lee has served as the Secretary/Treasurer for the Portage County Police Chiefs Association since 2013. She has over 15 years' experience in conducting numerous assessments in the private industry as a role player and as an assessor. She has been conducting assessments with OACP as an assessor since 2015 and became a lead assessor in 2018.
