

Community Relations and Engagement Committee 2020 Summary Report August 26, 2020

The committee has been hard at work this year in developing and implementing the *Sharing Ohio's Best* program. This program was created to showcase the outstanding community policing programs our member agencies use. Starting in November 2019, we have selected one agency each month to be the following month's *Agency of the Month*. Then, working with Terri Hager, our webmaster, we share their submission to our membership. Additionally, working with the Law Enforcement Foundation, Christie Ward then works with the selected agency to spread the word to the local media. This is a win-win for all that are involved. This is just one additional way we can help share our good work. To-date, we have recognized 11 agencies in this program. We look forward to seeing other agencies participate soon.

Just as school was moving forward, pre-Covid, we had been continuing to work with our youth subcommittee/advocacy board to help spread our law enforcement purpose with teens. Unfortunately, just as talks were going forward with the Ohio Department of Education, school was shut down for the pandemic. We hope to resume youth topics very soon.

We continue to work with professional sports teams and organizations to promote unity. Currently, as of early September, we are close to organizing new efforts with the Cleveland Browns and Columbus Crew. Further work will begin soon with the NFL Hall of Fame in Canton. We will be in more discussions very soon on how we can work together to accomplish more with the NFL Hall of Fame.
